




A pressing need













What is the Lower Thames Crossing?

- Major new road linking Kent, Thurrock and Essex
- Longest road tunnel in the UK
- One of the world's largest bored tunnels
- Most ambitious road scheme since M25
- Connects A2/M2, A13 and M25








Design changes

- M2 and A2 widened
- Tunnel 600m longer in Kent
- Rest and service area to the west of East Tilbury
- A13 junction modified to cope with the traffic levels
- M25 corridor and M25 junction 29 widened
- Road lowered up to 6 metres at numerous locations



Crossing under the River Thames

16 metre diameter tunnel for each direction



3 lanes in both directions




2.5 mile tunnel









Traffic stats

- LTC will increase capacity across the Thames east of London by more than 90%
- 27 million drivers will use the LTC in its first year - relieving congestion at Dartford by 22%, immediately improving journey times, resilience and reliability
- LTC route capacity which accommodates exceptional volumes of HGVs
- Local network integration which minimises community impact and ratrunning
