SELEP backs University of Essex Parkside project with £5m funding allocation

The South East Local Enterprise Partnership (SELEP) has awarded the University of Essex a £5 million funding package from the Local Growth Fund (LGF) for Phase 3 of the Parkside Office Village project at its Knowledge Gateway research and technology park.

This latest phase will extend the highly successful Parkside Office Village to offer more space for businesses wanting to co-locate at the University's Colchester Campus as an anchor tenant.

One of the purposes of the project is to help retain highly skilled workers within the local economy who would otherwise move away from the area after graduation. There are currently 25 businesses located at Parkside Office Village, collectively employing 270 people, 34 of whom are graduates or students of the University of Essex.

Overall, the £10.5 million project is expected to deliver up to 300 jobs by 2022.

SELEP pays visit to LGF-backed Mercury Rising project ahead of theatre re-opening

As the reopening of Colchester's Mercury Theatre moves ever closer, representatives from major funders and local and national government were invited to take a tour of the site to see progress, including local MP Will Quince and SELEP Vice Chair for Essex George Kieffer.

The £9.8 million project will see three new rehearsal and studio spaces, a fully refurbished main auditorium, new front of house facilities including a larger more welcoming café & bar space, more toilets and vastly improved accessibility across the entire building. There will also be a designated space for the support of emerging creative businesses in the South East region.

The project is funded by SELEP through the Local Growth Fund, Arts Council England, Essex County Council, Colchester Borough Council, European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), private trusts and foundations and the generosity of the local community.

Applications open for Community Grants of up to £20k in South East

Call for projects to transform **Thames Estuary into cultural hub**

Creative Estuary – a partnership of public sector and cultural organisations – has called for projects to submit bids to become one of four 'lead partners' for Estuary 2020, the month-long festival of visual art, literature and film taking place later this year.

Creative Estuary has four £15,000 awards, one for each festival hub which will be located in Shoeburyness, Southend and Pitsea, Basildon in South Essex, and Gravesham and Chatham Intra in North Kent.

The organisation said it wants to work with emerging producers, curators, artists/creative practitioners and organisations to create work that reflects marginalised, hidden or forgotten peoples, activities, locations and histories.

Kent's Discovery Park becomes Life Sciences Opportunity Zone

Discovery Park, the life sciences park based in Sandwich, Kent, has been recognised by the Government's Office for Life Sciences as a Life Sciences Opportunity Zone (LSOZ) alongside five other locations nationally, lending credence to the park's growth potential, particularly in advanced manufacturing, digital and artificial intelligence within healthcare.

The new LSOZ status will help Discovery Park attract investment, deliver jobs, drive economic growth and deliver improved health services, as well as be a part of developing a regional life sciences cluster. Government officials will work with Discovery Park to attract investment from national and international businesses.

The news comes as the Government announces a £10 million investment, which is designed to attract the world's top scientists, researchers and mathematicians, and will go hand-in-hand with a new visa route for overseas scientists and researchers that has come into law.
