3.1	The Board noted that the Grays Shopping Centre project is no longer able to proceed, releasing up to £1.8m for reallocation.	
3.2	 The Board have agreed, subject to confirmation that projects are in a position to proceed quickly, switch funding to the next projects, up to the value sought for Grays, on the priority list as agreed by the Board at its September meeting. These projects are: Social Properties as Energy Centres (Southend) Laindon High Street Improvements (Basildon)

	Final submission following discussions with project leads is below. We have confirmed that the Social Properties as Energy Centres is not able to proceed in the timing required by the Getting Building Fund.
